

Opening Pheasant Season Is Here!

In 2011, South Dakota hosted over 160,000 resident and nonresident hunters. Over 1.5 million pheasants were harvested, and a whopping \$226 million was spent by resident and non-resident hunters in South Dakota towns. Mobridge is surrounded by excellent pheasant hunting lands, and we are very excited to welcome new and returning hunters again this year.

Pheasant season opens on Saturday, Oct. 19 at noon. With funding from the SD Department of Tourism and the Tourism Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, Mobridge will have a new event to welcome hunters with this year. With rules similar to those of a poker run, Ringo Bingo encourages hunters will visit various eating and drinking establishments to fill their cards and enter to win prizes, including the grand prize of a CZ 912 Semi-Automatic Shotgun. Hunters may pick up Ringo cards at any bar, restaurant, or hotel in town.

The Chamber is also asking businesses to be creative in welcoming hunters into their businesses. Posting "Welcome Hunters" on your marquee sign, having staff wear hunter orange tshirts or hats that weekend, or getting creative with window paint or decorative orange lights are all ways to show hunters we appreciate their business and make opening pheasant season a big deal in our commercial district. 

An educational leadership program for emerging leaders in Walworth, Corson, Dewey, and Campbell

Leadership Partners of North Central South Dakota is a program designed to leverage the passion of emerging leaders in Walworth, Corson, Dewey, and Campbell Counties to create a cohort of citizens who are better equipped to affect policies and practices in the state and in their communities, resulting in thriving small towns in the region.

Program

Participants will attend monthly half-day sessions designed to acquaint them with rural community issues, institutions, individuals, organizations and other entities available for addressing these issues. Each month's curriculum will focus on a separate area of concern such as economic development, education, tourism and government. In addition, the participants will learn and practice leadership skills for use in their professional and community service roles.

Purpose

- To identify and develop potential leaders from diverse backgrounds and acquaint them with community issues and the resources available to address those issues.
- To provide a format within which participants can meet existing community leaders and to encourage interaction among them.
- To help potential and existing leaders sharpen their leadership skills and improve their effectiveness in interpersonal situations.
- To develop ambassadors for North Central South Dakota.

Format

- Half-day sessions on the second Tuesday of each month at different locations such as Mobridge, Eagle Butte, Pollock, Selby, or other communities in the four-county area
- October session is open to the public
- Sessions held from 12 p.m. 4:30 p.m., Nov. May, with lunch provided
- Class projects, completed in small groups
- Day-long trip to Pierre in February
- Reading assignments selected to enhance the topics being discussed
- Commencement ceremonies following the program

Participants

Leadership Partners will select up to 20 participants who live or work in the four-county area, and who meet the following criteria:

- Have demonstrated a sincere commitment to and interest in the region.
- Have the potential for further advancement to leadership positions within their own
 organizations, which may place them in positions to influence community issues.
- Have the time available to participate in the *Leadership Partners* program, and have the support
 of the company or organization she/he represents. (To successfully complete the program, full
 attendance is required. An excused absence for one session, due to illness or family emergency,
 is available.)








Employers Must Provide Health Care Notice to All Employees

By October 1, employers must provide employees with a written notice regarding the availability of the health care exchange (or "Marketplace"). After October 1, the notice must be provided to all newly-hired employees within 14 days of the employee's start date.

The notice will inform employees of the existence of the Marketplace, describe the services provided by the exchange, and inform employees they may be eligible for a premium tax credit or a cost-sharing reduction through the exchange in certain circumstances.

South Dakota Retailers published a <u>sample letter</u> in their July 2013 Retail Prophet publication which employers may give to employees if the employer does not offer health care coverage. This month, they included a <u>sample letter</u> for employers that do offer health care coverage to some or all of their employees. PRAISE FOR A GREAT MAN

There are times when a person that never had the pleasure of meandering the streets of Mobridge; nevertheless, may have had an impact on the life of a friend, relative or maybe even yourself, that is why it is right to extend praise to such a noteworthy American.

On April 23, 2008 Dr. Michael DeBakey received the Congressional gold medal in the U. S. Rotunda. Above is pictured the $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch bronze version of the Dr. DeBakey gold medal. This U. S. Mint produced medal shows the doctor in his scrubs with like-clad doctors in the background at an operating table. The reverse shows a human heart superimposed over a globe. A quote from Dr. DeBakey, "The pursuit of excellence has been my objective in life" is inscribed on a ribbon encircling the heart.

Who was Dr. DeBakey? Good chance very few if any readers have heard of him. He was a renowned heart surgeon who pioneered heart bypass surgery and he invented medical devices for patients with heart problems. He was also recognized for developing the idea of MASH units (battlefield mobile surgical hospitals).

President George W. Bush, in awarding the medal, said this honor put Dr. DeBakey in the same company as Thomas Edison (inventor), Walter Reed (Army physician who confirmed mosquitoes transmitted yellow fever) and Jonas Salk (developed polio vaccine). Forty years earlier President Lyndon Johnson had presented DeBakey the Congressional Medal of Freedom.

Dr. DeBakey was originally from Lake Charles, Louisiana the son of Lebanese immigrants. He told the audience in attendance that his parents encouraged him to go to the library once a week and stressed the most important thing was to have a good education. Friends and colleagues at the ceremony noted he had operated on more than 60,000 patients. De. DeBakey was still active in research projects past age 90.

Dr. DeBakey died July 1, 2008 at age 99. His legacy is the extended lives his pioneering work has given to friends, family and maybe even ourselves.


COUPON CARDS


